### **3 Key Messages**

- 1) The Wales Biodiversity Partnership has an important role to play in Living Wales. We will have to change and develop to do this - as everyone will. The development of new Terms of References and membership of ecosystem groups is a key element of beginning this change.
- 2) Ecosystems consist of biodiversity, rocks, soil, water and air; "a dynamic complex of plants, animals and micro-organism communities and their non living environment interacting as a functional unit." as the UN Convention on Biological Diversity states.
- 3) A Living Wales is one of the major statements of policy principle by the Assembly Government. We are currently expecting it to sit below the Sustainable Development Scheme, which is our central organising principle and above the Environment Strategy and the individual policies which set out present detailed actions.

### **3 additional messages to share widely following further discussions:**

- 1) NEF. The NEF consultation comments are being taken into account by individual workstreams and by the central NEF team. You can enter into dialogue by joining a workstream (core - attending meetings - or wider network - reviewing papers by email) or contacting a workstream manager directly (details on the website). The workstreams are drafting papers which will form the basis for further consultation/discussion as they go on the website. We have already received some feedback and are grateful for more.
- 2) Biodiversity grants. Work is ongoing on improving the forms and processes. Jan is leading on this for WBP (and Julia for CCW) so please let them have any additional views. Clare who runs the scheme has agreed to meet with Chairs at our September meeting.
- 3) Senior WAG officials. Policy group members (as well as others) have agreed to approach appropriate WAG officials on your behalf. We have mechanisms in place to ensure that relationships can be built up and a range of specific habitat/species issues can be dealt with over time. A meeting will be held on 19th May in mid Wales to put in place these and other mechanisms. It would be really helpful to have your first passes of who you'd like to work with/talk to by then if possible. Please also let Tracey know if you wish to join us for the meeting.
